

# 2015 Toyota AFL Premiership Season

## Junior & Concession Policy - MCG

The following junior and concession policy applies to the sale of daily public ticketing during the 2015 Toyota AFL Premiership Season

### Junior Policy – Public Reserve

- Children aged 6-14 as at 1 January 2015 are eligible to purchase a junior ticket.
- Children aged 5 and under as at 1 January 2015 are entitled to enter the ground at no charge; however they must not occupy a seat.
- Persons aged 15 and over as at 1 January 2015 are classified as an adult, unless they hold valid Concession identification.

### Junior Policy – AFL Reserve (applicable to Guest Passes)

- Children aged 6-17 as at 1 January 2015 are eligible to purchase a Junior ticket.
- Children aged 5 and under as a 1 January 2015 are entitled to enter the ground at no charge, however they must not occupy a seat.
- Persons aged 18 and over as at 1 January 2015 are classified as an adult, unless they hold valid Concession identification.

### Junior Policy – MCC Reserve (applicable to Visitor Tickets)

For all MCC member events an adult is classified as 15 years and over as of the day of the event, while a child is classified as under 15 years as of the day of the event. Children under six are considered free of charge providing they are accompanied by an adult and do not occupy a seat.

### Concession Policy – Public Reserve and AFL Reserve (applicable to Guest Passes)

A person must have the appropriate form of concession to purchase a concession ticket. They must present the relevant concession documentation at point of purchase and upon entry to the ground. A second form of identification (eg drivers licence, Medicare card, credit card) may be requested when purchasing or utilizing a concession ticket to verify the concession entitlement. Persons who do not have the appropriate form of concession should not purchase a concession ticket.

Patrons holding one of the following cards are eligible to purchase a ticket at the concession rate;

- Centrelink issued: Pensioner Concession Card (PCC)\*
- Department of Veterans' Affairs card or Department of Veterans' Affairs issued Pensioner Concession Card\*
- Full time secondary or tertiary student cards^
- Centrelink issued: Health Care Card (HCC)\*.

\*Note: Cardholders only (not their dependants listed on the card) are entitled to the concession price.

^Note: Does NOT apply to international Student Cards.

The AFL is a National Affiliate of the Companion Card program and agree to provide an admission ticket for the cardholder's companion at no charge. The Companion Card program is applicable at all AFL Venues.
