Chris Lynn: A Member of the BBL Royalty

Born in Brisbane in April 1990 Chris Lynn showed outstanding talents as a young cricketer; representing Queensland at Australian Under 17 and Under 19 Championships at Brisbane, Hobart and Newcastle during the 2007-2008 period. Lynn's blossoming talent was recognised in 2009 when he was selected to play for his state. He firstly played in the white ball formats (T20 and ODD) followed by his debut in the Sheffield Shield; all of these selections taking place within a few months. In his second Shield match he compiled a superb 139 (194 balls, 22 fours) and gave some hint of the talent he possessed. In the following Shield season Lynn's outstanding 172 against Victoria aroused the interest of selectors and assessors around the country. He attended the Cricket Australia Centre of Excellence in 2012.

Lynn would go on to play 41 first-class matches in Australia between the 2009/10 and 2016/17 seasons, compiling 2743 runs at the respectable average of 43.53 with six centuries, his highest score being 250. As his career has unfolded, he has tended to concentrate more on white ball cricket. In domestic 20 and 50-over formats he has played 268 matches and compiled in excess of 7500 runs.

Lynn made his international debut in the 2013/14 season in a T20 International against England at Hobart; being 33 not out from 19 balls. He went on to play a modest 18 T20Is between 2013/14 and 2018/19; scoring 291 runs at 19.4 with a top score of 44. He also played four One Day Internationals between 2016/17 and 2018/19; scoring 75 runs at 18.44.

Notwithstanding his relatively limited forays into international cricket and the domestic first-class game, Lynn has achieved fame with his performances in both franchise and domestic T20 cricket. His deeds in the BBL have been outstanding. In 90 matches he has scored 2790 runs at an average of 37.2 and at a strike rate of 150.97 with 172 sixes; the latter two statistics being well in advance of those of his competitors. He has also played 94 matches for international franchises in India, Pakistan and the Caribbean; making in excess of 2500 runs.

Lynn's career across all forms of the game has been adversely affected by injuries commencing from relatively early in his career. He has experienced extended periods away from the game and several seasons have been truncated resulting from these injuries. One legacy of his injuries has been the adverse effect on his fielding resulting from persistent shoulder injuries.

At career's end Lynn's achievements, particularly in T20 cricket will be remembered with pleasure by those who have watched him play. Notwithstanding we may reflect on an opportunity lost. Here is a player who could, by this point, without the interruptions that have plagued him, graced the fields of first-class cricket more often than he has done and ultimately gone on to play Test cricket for his country.
