MELBOURNE RENEGADES V SYDNEY THUNDER LIBRARY FACT SHEET

The Lead Up

Twenty20 cricket began around the cricket world in the early years of this century. Initially a six-team state-based competition was setup in Australia. In the 2011-12 season the city franchise-based tournament, The Big Bash League (BBL), was established. The BBL comprised eight teams including two from both Melbourne and Sydney. In the 2011-12 tournament (BBL01) each team played the seven others once (28 matches) followed by two semi-finals and a final which was won by the Sydney Sixers. In the second season each team played six others once and one twice (32 matches) followed by the finals. This allowed both Melbourne and Sydney to introduce the "local derby" with a resulting boost in attendances. In 2017-18 the home-and-away season was extended to 40 matches; each team playing three teams twice (with the local derbies retained) and four teams once. From the 2018-19 season each team has played the seven others twice; a 56-match home and away series. A new five-team finals series was introduced in the 2019-20 season. The Eliminator is played between the fourth and fifth-placed teams with the loser eliminated, The Qualifier between first and second, The Knock-out between third and the winner of the Eliminator, The Challenger between the winner of the Knock-out and the loser of the Qualifier leading to The Final between the winner of The Qualifier and the winner of The Challenger.

At the start of the 2020-21 season (BBL10) Cricket Australia introduced three rule changes as set out below.

The **Power Surge** is a two-over period during which the fielding team is allowed only two players outside the inner fielding circle. The batting side can call for this at any point from the eleventh over of its innings.

The **X-Factor** player, named as either the twelfth or thirteenth player on the team sheet, can come into the match after the tenth over of the first innings and replace any player who is yet to bat or has bowled no more than one over.

The **Bash Boost** is a bonus point awarded at the ten-over mark of the second innings of a match to the team with the higher score at that mark. If the scores are tied the teams each get 0.5 points. The point will also be split if the second innings is delayed or interrupted or the match is abandoned.
