## The Lead-up

This is the first of six group matches at the Super 12 stage of the tournament to be played at the MCG leading up to the finals. The other group matches to be played at the ground are:

England v TBC	Wednesday, 26 October, 2022	3.00 pm
New Zealand v Afghanistan	Wednesday, 26 October, 2022	7.00 pm
Afghanistan v TBC	Friday, 28 October, 2022	3.00 pm
England v Australia	Friday, 28 October, 2022	7.00 pm
India v TBC	Sunday, 6 November, 2022	7.00 pm

The semi-finals will be played in Sydney at the SCG on Wednesday, 9 November 2022 and in Adelaide on Thursday, 10 November 2022 with the final being played at the MCG on Sunday, 13 November, 2022.

Today's teams automatically qualified for the 2022 tournament as a result of playing at the Super 12 stage of the 2021 tournament and their ICC rankings at 15 November, 2021. They are among the eight countries entering the 2022 tournament at the Super 12 stage.

## The Two Countries in the ICC Men's T20 World Cup to Date

The two countries have participated in the seven tournaments played to date: reaching the second of the final rounds (Groups E and F in 2007 and 2009 and Super 8s, 10s or 12s in succeeding tournaments) on each occasion. Pakistan has made the semi-finals on five occasions, going on to win once (2009) and being runner-up once (2007/08). India has made the semi-finals on three occasions, also winning once (2007/08) and being runner-up once (2014). They have played against each other on six occasions in the World Cup; India winning four times, Pakistan once with one being a tie. The tied match took place on 14 September, 2007 in Durban, South Africa during the first ICC tournament. It was the first time that the two countries had met in a World Cup match. Pakistan and India were to meet again in that first tournament in the final with India winning by five runs. The two countries would not again meet twice in a T20I World Cup. Summary scores of the tied match referred to above are set out below:

At Durban, September 14, 2007: **INDIA 9/141** (20 overs) (RV Uthappa 50, MS Dhoni 33; Mohammad Asif 4/18, Shahid Afridi 2/37) **tied with PAKISTAN 9/141** (20 overs) Misbah-ul Haq 53; IK Pathan 2/20). **India won the match after a Bowl-Out** where five players from each team bowled two balls each (turn-about) at the unprotected stumps, the aim being to hit them to record a point. The *Player of the Match* being Mohammad Asif of Pakistan.

India and Pakistan, in recent history, have not regularly played against each other in home and away cricket series apart from ICC-initiated tournaments in white ball cricket. In all T20Is the two countries have met on nine occasions - India winning six matches, Pakistan two, with one being drawn.
