## WHAT TO BRING



Debit or credit card

(The MCG is a cashless venue)



Noise cancelling headphones



Mobile phone with digital ticket



Sunflower lanyard



Drink bottle



Stimming or fidget spinner

## Prohibited items include:

- Backpacks or bags larger than A3 size
- Umbrellas
- Banners and posters larger than A4
- · iPads, Go Pros and selfie sticks
- Long lens cameras

Please note there is no cloaking available for the Ed Sheeran concert





I have downloaded my tickets via the Ticketek App. Tickets will be made available 48 hours prior to the concert.

> Patrons with tickets for sections A, B or C will need to collect a wristband from the marquees outside the MCG before entering the stadium.



I have a small bag, my Sunflower lanyard and a drink bottle and I'm ready to go to the concert



I will check my ticket for the correct gate to enter and then join the queue. Ed Sheeran is very popular so there will be a lot of excited and noisy people waiting to get inside the stadium.



Security guards will check my bag before I enter. They check everyone's bag for safety reasons.



The security guards will also scan me with their wand. They may ask me to turn around and lift my arms.



I will open my ticket and scan the barcode to enter through the turnstiles.



If I need help or assistance I can always ask the MCG staff, they wear orange, blue or green.



I will watch the concert from my allocated seat.



The crowd will make a lot of noise when they first see Ed Sheeran. Ed will also play his music very loudly and there will be flashing lights and fireworks.



If I need a break I can visit the sensory friendly space. The space is located in the Australian Sports Museum at Gate 3 on level 1

The Sensory Friendly Space can only hold 30 people at any one time. Once full, a 20 minute time limit will apply per person. All persons must be over the age of 18 or accompanied by an adult.



I can buy food and drink inside the MCG using my bank card.
