I may need to queue outside my allocated gate to get into the stadium. It could be crowded and noisy.




Before I enter, I will need to complete the MCG's security process. I may be asked to pass through a metal detector or open my bag. This is for safety reasons.



If metal is detected in the screening process, a security guard may also need to scan me with their wand. I will need to lift up my arms and turn around.



I will scan my ticket at the turnstile using my phone or membership card. When the light on the screen turns green, I will push the metal turnstile arms and go inside



I will find my seat using the information
on my tickets and watch the cricket
from this seat.

(Warne Stand only) or Level 3 (all other stands), Section Q is Level 4




The crowd will make a lot of noise when someone hits a six or goes out. Loud music may also be played before the cricket match starts and during any breaks. I may need to wear my headphones.



If I need a break from the cricket, I can visit the MCG's Sensory Friendly Space. I can enter via Level 1, inside the Australian Sports Museum at Gate 3.

If under the age of 18, I will need to be accompanied by an adult.



There are bathrooms, including accessible bathrooms inside the MCG on all levels. There is also a Changing Places facility on Level 1 inside Gate 3.



I can buy food and drink as well as cricket merchandise inside the MCG using my bank card. The MCG does not accept cash.



If I need help, I can ask the MCG Staff.
They wear orange, blue and green uniforms. Security, First Aid and Victoria Police are also available if I need them.
