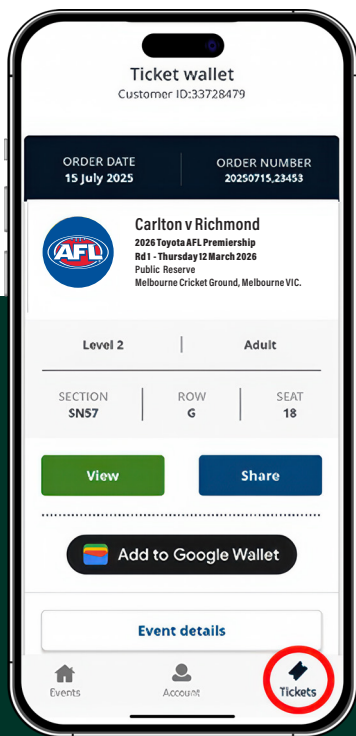


If I have mobility needs, I can use the free *G-Train shuttle service* to help me get from Richmond Station, Jolimont Station or the car park.

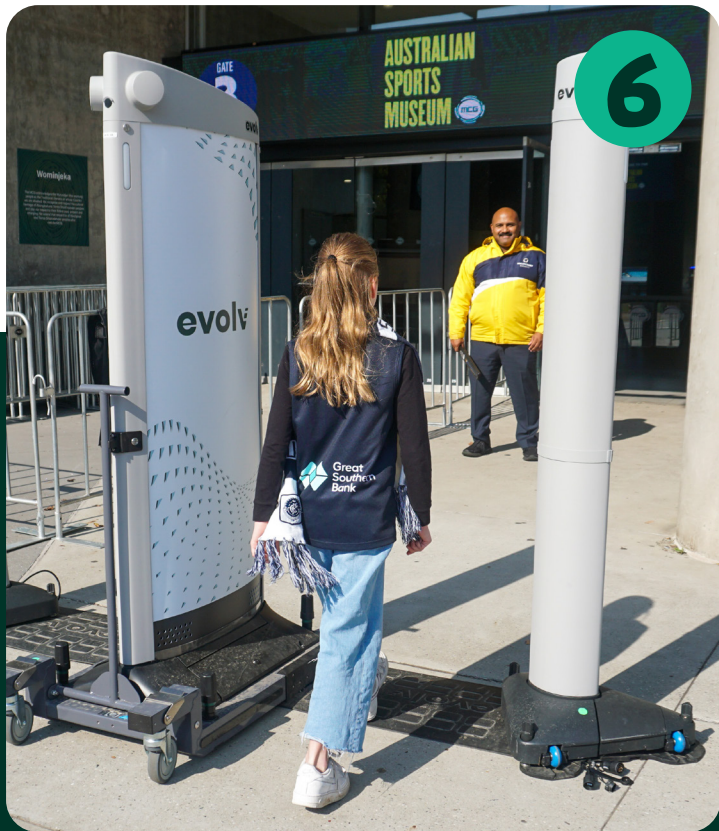


I have purchased and downloaded my ticket from the Ticketek app to my phone's wallet or I have my physical membership card.



When I arrive at the MCG, I will check my ticket for the correct gate to enter and then join the queue.

There will be lots of noisy and excited people waiting outside the stadium.



Before I enter, I will need to complete the MCG's security process. This is for safety reasons. I will need to pass through the metal detector and then wait for further instructions from the security guard.



The guard may need me to open my bag or scan me with their wand. I will need to lift up my arms and turn around.

I will scan my ticket at the turnstile using my phone or membership card.

When the light on the screen turns green and dings, I will push the metal turnstile arms and go inside.



I will find my seat using the information on my tickets and watch the footy from this seat.

Section M is Level 1, Section N is Level 2, Section P is Level 2A (Shane Warne Stand only) or Level 3 (all other stands), Section Q is Level 4.



The crowd will make a lot of noise when their team runs out, scores a goal, or the game ends. I might see flashing lights and flames, see and smell smoke or fireworks and hear loud music during breaks in play. I can wear my headphones if I want to.



If I need a break from the stimulation of the footy, I can visit the MCG's Sensory Friendly Space.

I can enter via Level 1, inside the Australian Sports Museum at Gate 3.

If under the age of 18, I will need to be accompanied by an adult.



**I can buy food and drink as well as footy merchandise inside the MCG using my bank card.
The MCG does not accept cash.**



If I need help, I can ask the MCG Staff.

They wear orange, blue and green uniforms. Security, First Aid and Victoria Police are also available if I need them.
